Science Key Vocabulary

Solid	Solids are objects that keep their own shape and do not flow in a given temperature

Source	The start of a river is called the source
Mouth	The mouth of a river is where the river enters the sea, ocean or lake.
Delta	A delta is a wetland area that forms as river waters empty into a larger body of water.
Tributary	When one stream meets another and they merge together, the smaller stream is known as a tributary .
Erosion	Erosion is the wearing away of the land by forces such as water
Pollution	when something is added to the environment that is harmful or poisonous to living things
